Guernsey-Muskingum Electric Cooperative, Inc. was saddened by the death of former General Manager/CEO Jerry Kackley on Sept. 3, 2019. Jerry served GMEC for 27 years, first hired in 1992 as an accountant and promoted to controller in 1994. In 2012, he was selected to become the general manager/CEO and held that position until his retirement in 2019. As general manager/CEO, Jerry served on the Buckeye Power board of directors and various Buckeye Power committees.

Jerry is survived by his wife, Debbie, and two daughters, Jessica and Andrea. The family has set up a scholarship in Jerry's name through the Muskingum County Community Foundation – the Guernsey-Muskingum Electric Cooperative Scholarship in honor of Jerry Kackley.

Now is the perfect time to plan an energy audit

By this time of the year, the beautiful autumn colors are moving toward the drab browns and tans of winter, the best items in the trick-or-treat basket have already been chosen, and there's cool, crisp nip to the air. This is

the perfect time to have an energy audit performed at your residence.

What is an energy audit, and why should you have one on your home? Energy audits are customized to each member, but the basic format is a troubleshooting and teaching session where I answer your questions, address your concerns, and use scientific equipment to identify opportunities and give you common sense solutions for them. The reason for an energy audit visit varies. Some top reasons include:

- High energy bills
- Cold or hot room or floor
- A rise in electric use
- Looking into a new HVAC system
- Considering solar
- Planning home improvements
- General curiosity about how good (or bad) a house is
- Insulation concerns

My first question to the member is, "Why do you have me here?" I then approach their audit according to their needs. With the member, I analyze the home's electric use history. I may go to the breaker box to check amperage draws, walk the home as we discuss concerns, or sit and answer questions. I often need to poke my head into the attic or crawl space to discuss insulation. The evaluations I do with scientific diagnostic equipment — the blower door and infrared camera — are of utmost importance, and this is the time of year when outside temperatures are well suited to this equipment.

A blower door is a frame and large fan that is installed in an exterior door along with controls and measuring equipment. The fan can put the house under pressure of vacuum. With the house under a lower air pressure than outside, every air leak in the structure will be letting air in, and I can quickly tell from measurements whether the house is tight or leaky. I find the leaks in a variety of ways, including feeling for them, looking for movement of cobwebs and curtains, or even holding up a tissue. The next step is to use the infrared camera.

An infrared camera shows everything in temperature differences. Cooler temperatures show up darker (black or blue) while warmer surfaces appear lighter (orange, yellow, or white). I can usually spot leaks with the camera that I might not be able to feel during an inspection. The infrared camera can also pick up voids or lack of insulation in walls or ceilings. On a few occasions, the camera has yielded some surprising results — a squirrel in the attic, a mouse nest in the wall, and a bad electric outlet.

Homeowners are usually surprised at what we find. Members find this service from your cooperative to be well worth their time, as they're able to learn the information they wanted to know along with some things they hadn't thought of. New vehicle for GMEC

In August, Guernsey-Muskingum Electric Cooperative took delivery of a Ford F-550 aerial lift truck. The truck was designed and assembled in Circleville, Ohio, by Utility Truck Equipment (UTE). UTE has been providing trucks and trailers to rural electric cooperatives and other utilities for over 30 years. Started by two partners in 1986, UTE continues today with 26 employees providing utility equipment to many of Ohio's electric cooperatives. Current owner and president, Ray Bricker, is proud of the professional services provided with a small business attitude.

Guernsey-Muskingum Electric recognizes good partners in the practice of providing safe, reliable electricity to the folks of southeast Ohio. "UTE has helped us design and build trucks that are safer, easier to use, and more efficient than those of decades past. They are honest, reliable guys to work with," says Rob Weber, GMEC operating superintendent.

"We are an assembler and distributor rather than a manufacturer," says Ray Bricker. "We take a chassis or truck base, add a utility body for storage compartments, and typically finish off with an aerial device. Once the truck is delivered to the utility, maintenance and repairs can be accomplished with one of our road services trucks."

Guernsey-Muskingum currently has five aerial-lift or bucket trucks and three digger-derricks. Trucks last between seven and 10 years. Like our personal autos, mileage is one measurement, but we also track the hours the trucks run. Once a truck arrives at a job site, that truck's day has only begun — the truck is used for hours, digging, lifting, and more.

CO-OP NEWS

Geothermal heating and cooling system — \$300 rebate

We have a \$300 rebate to help pay for the most efficient underground heating, cooling, and hot water system available today. To be eligible, the geothermal unit must be ENERGY STAR-rated and have a radio-controlled switch installed on the unit and on the electric water heater of at least 40-gallon capacity. Over 280 of our members are using geothermal.

Dual Fuel — \$300 rebate

If you install a new add-on electric heat pump with a fossil-fuel backup and have an electric water heater of at least 40-gallon capacity, you are eligible for a \$300 rebate. Radio-controlled switches must be installed on both the heat pump and water heater. Please call your cooperative for details. Over 890 members are using Dual Fuel.



Cool Returns — \$100 rebate

Are you having central air conditioning installed or a new electric heat pump with electric resistance heat backup? Allow your cooperative to install a radio-controlled switch and receive a \$100 rebate check. Over 170 members are using Cool Returns.

ENERGY STAR refrigerator/freezer rebate


Did you buy a new ENERGY STAR refrigerator or freezer? We may have a \$100 rebate for you. Call member services for details.

Water heater with a hole

The 4-inch hole in the side of our tank is great for cleaning out sediment. This rebated tank is available for free delivery. We also have \$50 or \$100 checks to send you if you purchase a tank somewhere else. Give us a call for details.

Water heater installation available

If you purchase your water heater from GMEC, our member services technician, Tim Fisher, may be able to install your water heater for an additional charge. Give us a call for details.



Radio-controlled switch

What a deal! If you don't already have a radio-controlled switch (RCS) for your electric water heater of at least 40-gallon capacity, please call, and Tim Fisher will install one at no charge. Over 5,600 GMEC members have an RCS on their water heaters. The switch entitles you to a discount and free maintenance (except cleaning), including parts and labor, on your electric water heater. Some exclusions apply; call us for details.

GenerLink

We want you to use your portable generator safely. Call the member services department at GMEC and ask about GenerLink. GenerLink eliminates the use of extension cords and other connections that can be dangerous to members and linemen. Over 200 members currently have a GenerLink installed at their homes.
